Kaiser Permanente Medicare Health Plan Rated Georgia's Best

Kaiser Permanente Georgia is the state's highest rated health plan for providing care and service to its Medicare members and the only plan in Georgia with a 5-star rating.

According to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services 2020 Star Quality Ratings, Kaiser Permanente Georgia's Medicare Advantage plan received 5 out of 5 stars, CMS's highest rating - only 20 plans nationwide were given a 5-star rating.

CMS annually rates health plans on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest, to provide beneficiaries with a way to assess Medicare plans based on the level of care and service delivery. Medicare health plans that earn 5 out of 5 stars can participate in a 5-star special election period and continue to enroll new individual members from December 8 through November 30 of the following year. Beneficiaries who want to change from their current Medicare health plan to a 5-star plan may switch once per year during the 5-star special election period.

Our 5-star rating demonstrates our commitment a culture of safety and performance improvement. We appreciate your continued partnership in providing coordinated and compassionate care and service to Kaiser Permanente Medicare members.

Fee Schedule Updates

It is the policy of Kaiser Permanente Georgia's Provider Contracting and Network Management Department (PC&NM) to review and update the fee schedules annually. PC&NM anticipates the 2020 updates based on the Medicare RBRVS fee schedules will be effective March 1, while any updates to the Kaiser Permanente Market Fee Schedule (KPMFS) or Enhanced Groupers will be effective April 1.

Procedure for Radiology Services



Routine radiology services do not require referrals in Kaiser Permanente Online-Affiliate. Most radiology services are available at multiple Kaiser Permanente medical offices throughout the Atlanta area. Refer to kp.org for a full list of facilities offering routine radiology services, including contracted facilities. Cardiac PET scans require authorization. For MRI and CT services, you must refer to a Kaiser Permanente medical office. MRI and CT scans not performed at Kaiser Permanente medical centers require authorization.

Radiology Ordering Procedure:

- Order radiology exams using the Kaiser Permanente Imaging Order Worksheet/Form/ Requisition found on the provider website (www.providers.kp.org/ga).
- 2. Complete and sign the order. The order must contain, at a minimum, the following information:
 - Diagnosis Code, symptom/and or disease
 - Clinical Information (Reason for Exam)
 - Physician Name, Office, and Fax Number (either in comments or on the prescription).
- 3. Fax the order to 1-877-206-2482 and provide the member with a hard copy. (To schedule an appointment at a Kaiser Permanente medical office, the member can call the appointment scheduling number (404-365-0966) at the top of the form. Or, to have services completed at a Kaiser Permanente contracted facility, the member can take the hard copy of the order to the nearest contracted facility listed on kp.org.)



Laboratory Services

You must submit your laboratory service orders either to our contracted laboratory vendor (Quest Diagnostics) or to a Kaiser Permanente medical office. Failure to do so will result in your office being liable for payment for services sent to a non-participating vendor.

Orders for outpatient laboratory services sent to Quest Diagnostics or Kaiser Permanente do not require referrals, however they do require a separate form/requisition that can be found on the provider website (www.providers.kp.org/ga).

- Orders for Quest Diagnostics should be submitted using a Quest Diagnostics requisition.
- Orders for a Kaiser Permanente medical office Lab should be submitted using the Kaiser Permanente requisition.



Note: Your contract may require you to send all laboratory services orders to Kaiser Permanente medical offices.

Laboratory services cannot be referred through Kaiser Permanente Online-Affiliate. We require you to provide diagnosis codes on all laboratory orders to either Kaiser Permanente or our contracted laboratory vendor.



New Online Affiliate Access Process

As an affiliate provider, you have access to great selfservice tools that will save your organization time and reduce costs. Online Affiliate is a web portal that allows external providers access to the following:

- Check Claim Status
- Member Benefits & Eligibility
- View and Print Remittance Advice
- Member Demographics

If you previously had access, your access was migrated to the new platform. Due to HIPAA regulations, you must keep your user information current for access to Kaiser Permanente Online-Affiliate. It is required that you regularly log on to maintain your access.

Failure to do so could result in loss of that access. Every user must have a unique ID and password. New staff members must obtain their own individual user ID and password. You are also required to inform KP when there is a change in staffing so that user IDs and passwords can be appropriately terminated.
