Insulin lispro (Humalog Kwikpen)

- * Intolerance excludes adverse drug reactions that are expected, mild in nature, resolve with continued treatment, and do not require medication discontinuation
- ^ insulinopenia is defined as a fasting c-peptide level of 0.88 ng/mL or less with a concurrent glucose of 70-225 mg/dL OR in patients with renal insufficiency (creatinine clearance of 50 mL/min or less), a fasting c-peptide level of 1.6 ng/mL or less with a concurrent glucose of 70-225 mg/dL.

<u>Initiation (new start) criteria</u>: Non-formulary <u>insulin lispro (Humalog Kwikpen)</u> or its <u>unbranded biologic</u> will be covered on the prescription drug benefit when the following criteria are met:

 Patient has a documented allergy or intolerance* to insulin aspart, or its biosimilar insulin aspart-xjhz (Kirsty)

-AND-

Meets 1 of the following criteria:

- Unable to draw up insulin accurately from a vial with a syringe due to young age, visual impairment, physical disabilities (e.g. amputations, tremors/Parkinson's disease, rheumatoid arthritis), or history of IV drug use
- Pediatric patient who is required to use such devices by school
- Diagnosis of type 1 diabetes mellitus or type 2 diabetes mellitus with insulinopenia

<u>Criteria for new members entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the</u>
<u>medication who have not been reviewed previously</u>: Non-formulary insulin lispro
(Humalog Kwikpen) or its unbranded biologic will be covered on the prescription drug benefit when the following criteria are met:

 Patient has a documented allergy or intolerance* to insulin aspart, or its biosimilar insulin aspart-xjhz (Kirsty)

Meets 1 of the following criteria:

• Unable to draw up insulin accurately from a vial with a syringe due to young age, visual impairment, physical disabilities (e.g. amputations, tremors/Parkinson's disease, rheumatoid arthritis), or history of IV drug use

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
