## Criteria-Based Consultation Prescribing Program CRITERIA FOR DRUG COVERAGE

## **Omeprazole 2 mg/mL Suspension**

## Notes:

- Quantity Limits: No
- Omeprazole 2 mg/mL suspension is compounded by Kaiser Permanente pharmacies. The suspension cannot be used beyond 14 days from the date of compounding.
- ^Adequate trial is defined as 14-day treatment duration
- \*Intolerance excludes adverse drug reactions that are expected, mild in nature, resolve with continued treatment, and do not require medication discontinuation
- \*\*If requested omeprazole dose is less than 20 mg per dose, or if patient has a feeding tube, trial of
  omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets (over-the-counter product) NOT required

## Initiation (new start) criteria, criteria for *current Kaiser Permanente members* already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously, and criteria for *new members* entering Kaiser Permanente already taking the medication who have not been reviewed previously:

Formulary **omeprazole 2 mg/mL suspension** will be covered on the prescription drug benefit when the following criteria are met:

- Patient is 10 weeks of age or younger **OR**
- Patient is older than 10 weeks of age AND
- Patient is unable to swallow solid dosage forms
- Patient has failed an adequate trial<sup>^</sup> of lansoprazole 3 mg/mL suspension or patient has an allergy or intolerance\* to lansoprazole
- If ordered omeprazole dose is 20 mg or above and patient does not have a feeding tube, patient must also fail an adequate trial<sup>^</sup> of omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets (over-the-counter product)\*\* OR patient has an allergy or intolerance\* to omeprazole oral disintegrating tablets

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
